A Message from Pastor Karsten—Summer Brings A New Feel

What is going on now that summer is here? Summer certainly brings a new feel to the days and for most everyone at least a slight change of schedule. Here at Our Redeemer, you can count on a lot being the same around the summer, but there are some special things that will mark our time over these next months.

Worship this June will have us focused on a four week preaching series around prayer. For most of us prayer is something we can appreciate and maybe even engage in, but something we might also struggle with, like others to do, or even feel some sense of incompetence. Your church Board in May deemed 'being a more prayerful congregation' one of the goals we want to work toward this year. So this June we will explore the gift prayer is meant to bring to life and faith, hear more about prayer work in the church, and try out a few different times/ways to pray. Bottom line is that we hope you will lean into this month with an openness and willingness to become more prayerful. We will encourage a prayer practice to grow over the weeks to help this 'conversation with God' become the source of strength, help, healing, wisdom, praise that prayer offers. Summer is a great time to use this different season for some quiet internal work – let's lean into being prayerful people together.

A note on worship this summer. We will continue in the schedule of the first two Sundays being traditional with the last two Sundays being contemporary. Once a month on the fourth Sunday (June 25, July 23, August 27), we plan to worship out in our back courtyard (weather permitting) as we have the past summers. In July and August on the third Sundays (July 16 – Battle Creek and August 20 – Lake Phalen) we will gather with the other East Side Lutheran churches for worship and lunch together. We are also in conversation with our other host churches (Kingdom Life and Messages of Power) to try having a shared service and meal again in August.

We are looking forward to being a collaborative host for a short term intern this Summer. You will read more about Emilia and her work in focused on congregational care inside of this newsletter. But Our Redeemer will be a part-time site for her to lead and learn as she prepares for a future position as a Deacon in a Chaplin setting. Be ready to meet and engage with her as she begins here in mid-June.

We again will be a host for two youth interns (Caileigh and Calvin) who will work primarily with the Community Sharing program but will also do some other work around the church with our rain garden, vegetable garden, and cleaning out some of our spaces. These youth are employed through the City of St Paul and will be here from mid-June to mid-August.

Want to step into some help around the church this summer? – talk to me about working with Community Sharing, the vegetable garden, reworking space to host Sisu school, cataloging music, assisting with mailings, serving on a Team (Missions, Worship Planning) help with VBS, learning our technology for worship. Our shared work makes for better ministry.



## Juneteenth—End to Slavery—A Federal Holiday

Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday. On June 17, 2021, it officially became a federal holiday.
