#### A Message from Pastor Karsten—A Mission to connect with Tanzania

It was almost 40 years ago that some Pastors from Saint Paul started getting connected in Tanzania and slowly drew others into the idea of being partners across the globe. Fast forward and now there are 54 Saint Paul Area Synod congregations that are partners with 65 Tanzanian congregations in the Iringa Diocese, located in the center of this country that is located on the Eastern coast of Africa in the midpoint of that continent. While the base of this partnership is congregation to congregation, many other helpful ministries have grown and developed over the years – a water ministry that drills wells, a health ministry that provides free medical checkups and care for pastors and lay leaders along with their spouses, an agricultural program that provides small loans to farmers while also buying bulk fertilizer and now building storage warehouses, an outreach to young women about hygiene and life resources, an orphanage that cares for almost 40 rejected or abused kids, and a planting program that has given out more than a million trees.

During our visit in early November. the main thing we will be doing is visiting our church partner, Kidewa. We will be warmly greeted and join together in worship and song and stories. We will also travel around the local area and visit the seven other preaching points connected to Kidewa – these communities are Fita, Ubamba, Ibumu, Nazareth, Mepra, Ivangwa and Chengelle. No doubt we will see the new church that was recently completed (for about \$4,500) at Chengelle with the help from Our Redeemer funds. They say "Asante Sana" – thank you very much. Building this church was their main priority these last years. When visiting, we will hear more reports about the growth of their church, the kids who received sponsorships, and what directions and goals lay ahead. We will share this information when we get back to Minnesota and see where this partnership leads us in the future.

As a partner congregation since 2017, we give Kidewa an annual gift from our Missions budget of \$1,000 which is the partnership fee that they use on projects. On top of that, we have committed another \$1,000 each of the past years for them to use for teenage students of their choosing for going to school (which entails living on a school campus and taking part in school life) – the students we are sponsoring are Enjo Lupala and Witness Chavala. We have done some other requests of special funds throughout the years. We are pleased to say that we have about \$3,000 in gifts so they can tend to other projects. This makes a big difference when the average income for an individual in Tanzania is about \$2,000/year.

This Bega Kwa Bega (BKB)—shoulder to shoulder—partnership is grounded on three pillars: prayers, presence, and projects – and if you want to know more, consider attending the BKB festival on November 10 (more details inside the newsletter). Many thanks to Our Redeemer over these past 6 years for being willing to live into this partnership well. The trip I am leading has people from five other congregations who will be connecting with their partner congregation so the impact of these weeks will be wide. This group will also be helping to run Day of Grace which is the medical program bringing in about 90 clergy and lay leaders with their spouses from the NE district for two days. We will also learn more about the good work and ministry that is going on now, visit some local sites (university, hospital, disabled workers craft center) and then end by enjoying a good African Safari.

This remarkable school in the Dominican Republic continues to do great work serving the students and families from that community. On a recent trip for a Board Meeting Pastor Karsten came away hearing more about the special services Doulos is providing to help over twenty of their students who has various kinds of learning challenges – autism spectrum, ADHD, and others. This kind of care for students is not usual in the DR and is one more way Doulos stands out. Our Redeemer was part of some recent Dessert nights where over \$20,000 was raised to help take advantage of a matching grant for 2023 to help use secure our new land on the side of a mountain. Thanks for past help and support toward this fine ministry.


