Most of you know Sally, and you know her deep love and support for this congregation and all of what we do. She carries a wide mix of responsibilities and one good gift is her writing. Here is a good take from this good addition to Our Redeemer:

As we depart from 2023 and reflect throughout that year, I'm guessing each one of us experienced some highs and lows, excitement and disappointments, successes and failures. As a church, we also experienced these fluctuations that life tosses in our path of our intentions and plans to make it a really good year. For example, we

took a leap of faith as a church trying to open our building to house a charter school. I remember more than one member telling me that the congregation was not ready for an ask like this. But we all knew we needed to lean into something which would allow us to grow as a church and potentially solidify our financial budget. Great people from here did all kinds of leg work to try and make this a reality. And while the school venture didn't happen in 2023, we laid an incredible foundation—through the grace of God—that strengthened our vision for a greater impact for the future of our church.

Here are only a few of our successes we accomplished that has had an impressive impact for the betterment of us and our community:

- Delved into a deep focus of prayer by developing some good tools to encourage and welcome 'prayers and praises' on a more consistent basis for our congregation and community. We also added new prayer opportunities on Sundays.
- Collaborated with East Side churches for shared services, events, and projects which led us to increased communication among our congregations and also outreach to the various communities surrounding our churches.
- Expanded our missional outreach not only locally but also through global efforts with our Tanzania family and Doulos school.
- Grew in our connections with our community by providing over 200 meals and \$5,000 in rescued groceries weekly through our Wednesday Community Sharing program.

Let me say thank you to each one of you for whatever involvement you may have given to make all of these a possibility—time, finances, prayers—thank you for responding to God's nudges and following Him through these endeavors.

As we move forward into 2024, I could not be more excited about how God is continually leading us as a congregation as we seek to make an impact for God's glory! Our journey has already started. God's abundance, light and potential encourages us and empowers us to live courageously, boldly and lovingly today and in the days ahead. More to come on where God is taking us next, but for now we celebrate His faithfulness!

The Budget Planning team is working through an initial budget that will first be presented to the Board in mid-January, and then be up for a fuller discussion in a forum setting on **Sunday, January 21** at **11:00 a.m.** in the Fireside Room. Those of you who are on our email list heard news that the initial numbers have us looking at a shortfall of around \$24,000. That news invited people to consider Our Redeemer for a year-end gift, and had us take some more steps to explore other funding options. We have some good potential avenues but there is nothing formalized yet. We anticipate knowing more by our budget forum on January 22.

Annual Congregational Meeting–January 28

This year our Annual Congregational Meeting will take place on **Sunday, January 28,** at **11:00 a.m.** in the Fellowship Hall immediately following our worship service. We will be electing two new Board representatives, approving a budget for 2024, and reflecting on ministry over this past year and into 2024. We might also be voting on having a new charter school renting our space. Church Board Vacancies

Every year at our January Annual Congregational Meeting, one of the things we do is elect a few new people to serve on the Church Board. This year we are looking to nominate two people to fill vacancies from departing members. If you would like to be considered (no need for being shy now) or would like a one-page description of the roles, please talk to Pastor Karsten or Carmen Snaza.

Irrawaddy Charter School–Potential Lease Opportunity

We are still in serious conversations with the leaders from a new Charter School called "Irrawaddy" that is considering Our Redeemer as their site. They are down to two options and should be making a decision in early January. If they choose to come here, there are two big projects we would need to tend to – the first being fire safety protection and the other being the installation of an air exchange system for the education wing. We are working on getting firmer bids for both of these projects. We estimate the fire safety plan would be about \$45,000-\$50,000. The anticipated costs for the air exchange (a necessary item for school code) would be between \$75,000 and \$100,000. The initial contract with the school would bring in \$168,000 the first two years, so we would recoup our costs over those years and have a building ready for this or another school in the future. The Board has had one long conversation about this partnership possibility and voted strongly in favor of moving forward, but any formal decision needs to be made by the whole congregation. This would happen at our Annual Congregational Meeting on January 28, at 11:00 a.m. Be prayerful about this possibility and ponder if this would be a helpful move for Our Redeemer.


