Our Redeemer - a little church that is part of something bigger

In many ways Our Redeemer is a smaller Lutheran Church. Our building size is not big, our membership hovers around 225 (a distant mark from when this community was up to 1,200), and our staff is pretty basic with one full time worker (me), two half timers (Sally in the office and Jeremy with music), and two more part time (Jim the Custodian and Jill the Finance person). All that being said, I would also state that Our Redeemer has a really deep and broad ministry life that is mainly seen in other larger congregations.

But Our Redeemer is actually much larger than what the eye sees. This is reflected in the Community Sharing program that recently has been serving over 250 free

meals every week to the community and giving away upwards of \$6,000-\$10,000 worth of food every Wednesday. That is big care for the local community. We continue to be a partner with Doulos School in the Dominican Republic by supporting two students and assisting with recent generous fundraising for buying new land. And then farther across the world, we have our partners in Tanzania (Kidewa) who receive both student scholarships and donations for building projects. We are a small church but deeply connected to others.

The other way Our Redeemer is part of something bigger is that we are one Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) Lutheran church in the St. Paul Area Synod (SPAS), but there are 109 others. They are our brother and sister congregations in ministry. Of course we have some deeper ties and collaboration with the other East Side Lutherans, but our ties to SPAS joins us to a wider network of care and outreach and shared significance in this region. Together we are advocates for social justice and workers for stronger climate care. Through the work of the Synod, we have stronger leadership through various workshops and offerings. Through the Synod, we have healthier congregations as the staff assist when there is congregational conflict or personnel misconduct, during times of transitions and with practical workshops around youth ministry, stewardship and renewal work. Through the Synod, we have developed ties and partnership in Tanzania and Guatemala. We are a part of this larger body and that makes us bigger than we really are.

So, in many ways, Our Redeemer is more than just what we see by looking at a building. We are one part of a larger complex that makes a big difference in the St. Paul area and beyond. And being one healthy, strong, capable congregation helps carry our weight for being a good partner in being the hands and feet of Christ for our members, our neighbors, and the wider world.

Offering Envelopes

One change is coming to Our Redeemer this spring in terms of our offering envelopes. In order to save some costs with what had been the quarterly personalized packages of offering envelopes, and to adjust to fewer people actually using the envelopes (especially on a weekly basis) due to more online giving or monthly giving patterns, we are moving to a new less expensive plan.

Later in April, a smaller supply of similar looking envelopes will be sent to all members who currently receive envelopes. This will contain six envelopes that can be used for any of the upcoming weeks. These will not be personalized and therefore will not include your envelope number. We will be able to identify your offering from your name on your check or you can add your envelope number if you prefer. We can identify you by either the envelope number or your name.

We will send out another packet of envelopes again in the summer and will continue in this pattern throughout the year. If you want/need extra envelopes, there will always be a supply at the Welcome Desk, or you can call the office to request more be sent to you. If you no longer want envelopes mailed to you, please contact the office.

We have new developments in our leasing family...

Welcome Trinity Baptist Karen Church!

We are pleased to announce that another church will be worshiping under our roof—*Trinity Baptist Karen Church* (TBKC). In May, they will begin worshiping on Sunday's at 2:30 p.m. occupying the Sanctuary as well as Sunday school rooms and the nursery. They will also be in the Sanctuary and Sunday school rooms on Saturdays from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. The number of members are currently in the 100-150 range, which include about 40 children.

TBKC is a Karen ethnic minority group from Burma also know as Myanmar. Most of their church members fled to Thailand refugee camp because of the civil war in their country and persecution created by the Burmese military. Most of them spent decades in refugee camp until they were able to come to Minnesota. Most of them came to Saint Paul between the years 2010 and 2017. They are friendly and opened minded. However, they expressed to us that their language barriers may be the most difficult for their members to communicate or establish good relationships with us. When they first came to Minnesota, they spent 13 years at LifePoint church—and then the last year, they have spent their time at SDA. They said they are looking forward to joining our church community and working together with all of us! We will plan on having some combined worship services as time moves forward.

Welcome Recovery AA Crafting!

We recently welcomed a small *Recovery* group who combine AA meetings and crafting. They hold their meetings in a Sunday school room Saturdays from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. They are grateful to be able to meet here, which is convenient for some of their members who need to use bus transportation. Currently, the number of members range from 6 to 12.

Mensajes de Poder-Moving Up

After *Messengers for Christ* church left last month, the *Mensajes de Poder* congregation moved their Sunday worship time from 4:00 p.m. to 12:00 p.m. [They also have a service on Saturdays at 6:00 p.m. and their band practices every Friday at 7:00 p.m.]


