From our Deacon Intern Jake: Grief support group to start up soon

Beloved friends and neighbors,

Our Redeemer seeks to be a place of community for people in all life situations and from all walks of life. We are committed to walking together through the highs and lows of life, and that includes issues which are simply too big for any one of us to handle alone. Though they are difficult to address at times, the problems of grief, loss, and death are likely familiar to most of us in one way or another.

Though we are promised eternal life through Christ, we still deal with loss in many forms in our time here on Earth. When these times come, we could do what so many of us do and soldier on, relying on few others and seeking to get back to normal as soon as possible. Alternatively, we could do what we see modeled so many times through the life and ministry of Jesus Christ and lean on our friends, family, and community for love and support. We could live into grief rather than hiding from it. We could allow ourselves to be vulnerable and feel the comfort and peace that comes through supportive, Christ-like community.



These are issues that all of us will face, and that means that in these issues we are not ever alone. Whether you are grieving the loss of a loved one, a change in employment, or something else entirely, the community of Our Redeemer is here to lean on.

To tackle this more directly, we will be starting up a grief support group this summer sponsored by the East Side Collaborative. This will all kick off with an event known as a Death Cafe. If that name sets off any alarm bells, that is the point! This event will be open to the community and will be a time to demystify death and grief. We will be having open and honest conversations with each other about death, how it affects us, and how it can help us live our lives more meaningfully. The Death Cafe will be hosted at



Gustavus Adolphus Lutheran Church on **May 30**, from **5:30 to 7:00 PM**. Refreshments will be provided and all are welcome! The grief support group will be spinning out of that event, and more information will be available in the near future, so keep your eyes open for that!

These are not easy burdens to bear, but by coming together in faithful community we can lighten their load on our lives. We hope to see you there.

Update on Offering Envelope Changes

As noted in the April newsletter, we made plans to change our offering envelope process which was to begin in May, but the envelope company inadvertently sent out an additional batch of envelopes in mid -April that can be used through July. We will be sending out a letter in mid-summer that will include new envelopes that have a similar look (excluding names, dates and envelope numbers). We will be making this move to more generic envelopes for cost-saving purposes since many people do not use these weekly envelopes and instead are giving once or twice a month, or quarterly, or online. Those who want to use weekly envelopes will still get them, and there will be extras

available every Sunday. More details will be shared in July.

your regular General Fund offerings as well as other special designated gifts we received from you such as for Community Sharing, the Ministry Support 2024 Appeal, and memorials. On May 4-5, we will welcome *Trinity Baptist Karen Church* (TBKC) to Our Redeemer. They are worshiping on Sunday's at 2:30 p.m. occupying the Sanctuary as well as Sunday school rooms and the nursery. They are also in the Sanctuary and Sunday school rooms on Saturdays from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.

TBKC is a Karen ethnic minority group from Burma also know as Myanmar. Most of their members fled to Thailand refugee camp because of the civil war in their country and persecution created by the Burmese military. Many spent decades in refugee camp until they were able to come to Minnesota between the years 2010 and 2017. They said they are looking forward to joining our church community and working together with all of us!

LSS provides housing services to help individuals and families gain housing stability, attain educational and employment goals, and maintain housing stability. LSS also works with housing developers and property owners to provide safe and stable housing for people supported.

Gifts of handmade quilts are especially appreciated because they make a new and unfamiliar place feel more like home to individuals and families who have been highly mobile and likely unsettled for some time. The colorful quilts also are a daily reminder for them that they are not alone and that there are caring members of our community who support them and pray for them on their journey.
